As many of you have already become aware of, the girls' uniform blouse from Lands' End has been discontinued. Therefore, here are the numbers for the replacement blouses.

Short Sleeve: Adults (size 4-18): 41478-1BQ3
Girls (size 7-16): 41477-9BQ6
Juniors (size 1-13): 41478-0BQ9

$\frac{3}{4}$ Sleeve: Adults: 41476-6BQ9
Girls: 41476-5BQ4
No Junior sizes in $\frac{3}{4}$ sleeve.

Long Sleeve: Adults: 41477-1BQX
Girls: 41476-9BQ2
Juniors: 41476-8BQ8

If your daughter's blouse from last year fits and is still in good condition, those of course, are acceptable, as well as the few Lands' End still has at a greatly discounted price.

Re: Change in dress code for young women

The School Administrative Team has approved the attached change to our dress code for 6-12 grade young women effective at the beginning of the 2012-2013 school year.

Notes:

- Issues such as proper fit for all, availability over a number of years, etc. have prompted the School Administrative Team to change from a uniform policy to a dress-code policy.
- ACS continues to use a uniform policy for the young women's blouses. Please refer to previous documentation if you need clarification.
- As previously communicated, 9-12 young women will be required to periodically wear a blue blazer beginning in September 2012.
- We've tried hard to make the attached memo clear; however, it is impossible to cover every possible variation. The decision of the school administration will continue to govern the interpretation of the dress-code in specific cases as well as rule on issues not addressed in the attached document.

Revised Policy for the skirts worn by ACS 6th through 12th grade young women.

Effective September 2012

1. Abandon the “uniform” standard for MS & HS skirts. i.e. no longer require students to wear a particular skirt from a particular vendor.
2. Implement a “Dress Code” standard (similar to what we do for the young men)
 - a. Khaki color
 - b. Plain (i.e. without stitched or fabric embellishment)
 - c. Maximum length of slit: 3 inches
 - d. Medium weight fabric. No gauze, chiffon or similar light weight fabrics. No denim or corduroy.
 - e. No patch (i.e. exterior) pockets
 - f. No shorter than MID-KNEE
 - g. No longer than MID-CALF

Dear High School Parents,

I am writing to let you know of two upcoming modifications to our dress code.

1. High school students are to wear their casual uniforms each Friday.
2. Beginning in January, high school young men are to wear a blue blazer on Tuesday s. (This will be extended to include the young women at the beginning of 2012-2013.)

You may wonder about the reasons for these changes, especially the second. The School Administrative Team feels that the incorporation of the, up to now, optional blazer will help ACS honor occasions and individuals better. The school year provides many opportunities for showing honor (e.g. Veteran's Day, guest speakers, special visitors to ACS, etc.)

Second hand stores and area thrift shops almost always have a good supply of men's navy blazers. Of course not every store has every size every day; but it is reasonable to anticipate that with a bit of diligent scouting all of our high school young men will have the required blazer by the time school starts in January.
